

I, Alice Bradley, am a sole practitioner offering private counselling and psychotherapy services. I adhere to current data protection legislation, including the General Data Protection Regulation (EU/2016/679) (the GDPR), the Data Protection Act 2018 and the Privacy and Electronic Communications (EC Directive) Regulations 2003. This privacy notice tells you what I will do with your personal information from initial point of contact through to after your therapy has ended.

'Data controller' is the term used to describe the person/ organisation that collects and stores and has responsibility for people's personal data. In this instance, the data controller is me. I am registered with the Information Commissioner's Office Reg Number (ZC113528). My email address is: info@alicebradley.co.uk The GDPR states that I must have a lawful basis for processing your personal data. There are different lawful bases depending on the stage at which I am processing your data. I have explained these below: If you have had therapy with me and it has now ended, I will use legitimate interest as my lawful basis for holding and using your personal information. If you are currently having therapy or if you are in contact with me to consider therapy, I will process your personal data where it is necessary for the performance of our contract. The GDPR also makes sure that I look after any sensitive personal information that you may disclose to me appropriately. This type of information is called 'special category personal information'. The lawful basis for me processing any special categories of personal information is that it is for provision of health treatment (in this case counselling and psychotherapy) and necessary for a contract with a health professional (in this case, a contract between me and you).

When you contact me with an enquiry about my counselling and psychotherapy services, I will collect information to help me satisfy your enquiry. This will include name, telephone number and email. Alternatively, your GP or other health professional may send me your details when making a referral. If you decide not to proceed, I will ensure all your personal data is deleted within 1 year. If you would like me to delete this information sooner, just let me know.

Rest assured that everything you discuss with me is confidential and would only be shared carefully in the following cases:

- During professional supervision. Information shared in supervision is a standard ethical requirement, with supervisors bound by confidentiality.
- If there is a significant risk of harm to yourself or to others.
- If there is a legal obligation (e.g. safeguarding concerns or court order).

I will keep a record of your personal details to help the counselling and psychotherapy services run smoothly. These details are kept securely electronically and are not shared with any third party. I will keep brief and anonymised written notes of each session. These are also kept electronically and encrypted, using reputable and recognised software. In the event of my death or incapacitation, a clinical will has been drawn up so that all data can then be accessed and deleted by a chosen clinical professional.

Once counselling has ended, your records and correspondence will be kept for 7 years from the end of our contact with each other and are then securely destroyed. If you want me to delete your information sooner than this, please tell me. Please note that in some circumstances, I may be required to retain certain records to meet legal, regulatory, or professional obligations (e.g., for my professional indemnity insurance or in the event of legal claims).

I try to be as open as I can be in terms of giving people access to their personal information. You have a right to ask me to delete your personal information, to limit how I use your personal information, or to stop processing your personal information. You also have a right to ask for a copy of any information that I hold about you and to object to the use of your personal data in some circumstances. You can read more about your rights at ico.org.uk/your-data-matters. If I do hold information about you I will:

- give you a description of it and where it came from.
- tell you why I am holding it, tell you how long I will store your data and how I made this decision.
- tell you who it could be disclosed to.
- let you have a copy of the information in an intelligible form.

You can also ask me at any time to correct any mistakes there may be in the personal information I hold about you. To make a request for any personal information I may hold about you, please put the request in writing addressing it to info@alicebradley.co.uk
